Objectives and investment policy

Objective

7IM Pathbuilder 4 Fund aims to provide a return of capital and income over the medium to longer term (5 years or more) consistent with its risk profile.

Investment Policy

The fund's investments will be determined by its risk profile (described in the Investment Strategy section) with a balanced exposure to fixed interest securities and equities. The fund will gain exposure to either direct investments in investment grade corporate or government bonds and, or indirectly through collective investment schemes (including some managed by the Manager), investment trusts, exchange traded trusts or derivative instruments.

Essential features of the fund:

- The fund will gain exposure to equities and fixed interest by investing in other funds and exchange traded funds and will be managed in accordance with passive strategies (i.e. which track the performance of particular indices, market sectors or asset classes).
- The fund has no specific target market, asset class or geographic sector.
- Up to 20% of the fund can be invested in cash deposits and similar assets. In extreme market conditions only this percentage could increase to 100%.
- You can buy and sell shares in the fund on each UK business day but cut-off times apply.
- The fund aims to distribute available income every six months.
- Derivatives are used for investment purposes and to manage the risk profile of the fund.
- This fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 5 years.

Investment Strategy

The fund is part of the 7IM Pathbuilder Fund range which is made up of four funds with different risk profiles numbered 1-4. The fund is at the highest end of the range. Through its long term strategic asset allocation (SAA) the Manager will customise the most suitable mix of asset classes for each of the Pathbuilder risk profiles.

Performance Comparator

The fund does not use a comparator, constraining or target benchmark to assess performance. Performance may be assessed by considering the extent to which the fund has met its investment objective. Once the fund has one calendar year's performance, the fund's returns will be published on the 7IM website.

Risk and reward profile

The Risk and Reward Indicator table demonstrates where the Fund ranks in terms of its potential risk and reward. The higher the rank the greater the potential reward but the greater the risk of losing money. It is based on past data, may change over time and may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund. The shaded area in the table below shows the Fund's ranking on the Risk and Reward Indicator.

- The lowest number on the scale does not mean that a fund is risk free.
- The fund has been classed as 5 because its volatility has been measured as above average.

- The risk and reward profile shown is not guaranteed to remain the same and may shift over time.
- Counterparty Risk: As the fund may enter into derivative agreements there is a risk that other parties may fail to meet their obligations. This may lead to delays in receiving amounts due to the fund, receiving less than is due or receiving nothing.
- Credit Risk: Fixed interest securities are affected by trends in interest rates and inflation. If interest rates go up the value of capital may fall and vice versa. Inflation will also decrease the real value of capital. The value of a fixed interest security is also affected by its credit rating.
- Currency Risk: As the fund invests in overseas securities movements in exchange rates, when not hedged, may cause the value of your investment to increase or decrease.
- Derivative Risk: The fund invests in derivatives. The use of derivatives may, through gearing, have a larger impact, positive or negative, than if only the underlying investments were held.
- Emerging Market Risk: Emerging markets may be less liquid and transparent, more volatile and subject to less oversight. There is a greater risk that other parties may default, causing loss to the fund.

Charges

The charges you pay are used to pay the costs of running the Fund, including the costs of marketing and distributing it. These charges reduce the potential growth of your investment.

The ongoing charges figure is based on the last year's expenses and may vary from year to year. It excludes the costs of buying or selling assets for the Fund (unless these assets are shares of another fund). The ongoing charges figure is based on an estimate of the future charges as the fund was launched on 3 December 2021. Where income is insufficient to pay charges the residual amount will be taken from capital. They exclude portfolio transaction costs, except in the case of an entry/exit charge paid by the fund when buying or selling units in another collective investment undertaking. You may also be charged a dilution levy on entry to or exit from the fund. For any funds undertaking securities lending, the fund will receive 70% of the revenue generated and the remaining 30% will be received by Northern Trust as the securities lending agent. As securities lending revenue sharing does not increase the costs of running the fund, this has been excluded from the ongoing charges.
